Preparations for the Indonesian Study Tour in June are well advanced. We have 28 members from all Australian states (except South Australia) joining us. John McCarthy AO FAIIA, a former ambassador to Indonesia is arranging several meetings in Jakarta. Two breakfast meetings in Jakarta will enable us to meet some Australian interests in Indonesia. The study tour then flies on to Yogyakarta and then to South Sulawesi for six nights and finishing in Bali.

Some time ago we recognised the need to lift the profile of the AIIA in Melbourne. To that end, we are delighted to announce that we have appointed five Honorary Councillors. They are Jenny Bloomfield (Director of DFAT Victoria State Office), Jonathan Forster (Founder of Kane Constructions), Professor Stewart Gill OAM (Master of Queen's College), Colin Heseltine (former Ambassador to Korea) and Elizabeth Proust AO (Company Director).

## Speaker Events

We have started our 2019 events program most successfully with your help. This follows our many successful events in 2018. Over the past 15 months since the beginning of 2018 almost 2,500 members and guests have attended our widely popular public speaker events. In 2018, we were fortunate and thankful for the strong support from DFAT's Victoria State Office for their assistance with lining up unique and exceptional speakers. Last year we welcomed impressive speakers on a range of topics from the role of Artificial Intelligence to Arctic and Antarctic Security.



"After Brexit: Where next for the UK?" by Prof Richard Whitman

Our first event for 2019 "*After Brexit: Where next for the UK?*" was delivered by Prof Richard Whitman and was a full house. Richard provided an in-depth assessment on UK Prime Minister Theresa May's looming Brexit and the doubt hovering over her failed Brexit deal in British Parliament. The next lecture was given by Prof Obiora Okafor who presented his findings on the UN Declaration of Human Rights

and its impact on the rights of refugees. The Institute also welcomed H.E. Mr Brendan Berne, Australian Ambassador to France, who spoke about the Franco-Australian relationship in the Indo-Pacific, and then Dr Raul Sanchez-Uribarri who spoke about the current situation in Venezuela. Council Member Richard Iron CMG OBE held the latest of his acclaimed "In Conversation" series with the Australian Ambassador to Ukraine, H.E. Ms Melissa O'Rourke, on the ongoing crisis in Ukraine. Andrew Parker of PwC was also welcomed by the Institute and presented his expertise on Australia's economic engagement with Indonesia. Last week we welcomed Dr Ben Wellings who spoke about Brexit as English Nationalism and this week we were pleased to have Michael Doran of the Hudson Institute who discussed President Trump's Middle East policy.

We will have many more public events on the issues facing the world in 2019. From the Cuban Missile Crisis 2.0 to UN Peace Operations, AIIA Victoria will be at the forefront of lectures and talks on international affairs in Melbourne.

## International Careers Conference

The International Careers Conference (ICC) remains the largest annual event of the Institute and is in its 15th year. With the Hon. Justice David Harper AM stepping down as Chair, Warren Evans will be taking over the role. The ICC this year will take place on Friday August 30 at The Arts Centre Melbourne. The Conference itself will be broken up into three main components: Keynote Speaker; Panels covering the Government, Business and Not-For-Profit sectors, and a series of career-specific Masterclasses.

Although planning remains at an early stage, several prominent potential keynote speakers have been approached to fill that role. Similarly, once initial meetings with this year's interns take place, we shall look to lock in a diverse range of representation for the various panel and masterclass positions. Initial advertising and social media posts for the event have also already been published.

While much hard work is still required, the 2019 ICC is again well placed to deliver another successful event in fulfilling the institutes' aim of encouraging and assisting students to engage with international affairs through a career in this field.
